KITCHEN VERBS



Kitchen verbs

Bake

“

Bake:

*verb [intransitive, transitive]
to cook something using dry heat,
in an oven*

*Eg: Bake the potatoes at 150
degrees for 15 minutes.*

”

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Kitchen verbs

Boil

“

Boil:

[intransitive, transitive] when a liquid boils, or when you boil it, it becomes hot enough to turn into gas

Eg: Water boils at 100 degrees Celcius.

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Kitchen verbs

Dip

“

Dip:
verb (transitive)
to put something into a liquid
and lift it out again
Example: Dip the strawberries
into melted chocolate.

”



Kitchen verbs

Grate

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Grate:
To cut (food) into very small pieces by rubbing it against a special tool (called a grater).

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Kitchen verbs

Grill

“

Grill:

[intransitive, transitive] if you grill something, or if it grills, you cook it by putting it on a flat metal frame with bars across it, above or below strong direct heat

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Kitchen verbs

Layer

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Layer:

[transitive] to make a layer of something or put something down in layers

Eg: Layer the raw sliced vegetables in a shallow baking dish.

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Kitchen verbs

Melt

“

Melt:

[intransitive, transitive] if something solid melts or if heat melts it, it becomes liquid

Eg: The first step to make a Banana Foster is to melt the butter in a pan.

Kitchen verbs

Pour

“

Pour:

[transitive] to make a liquid or other substance flow out of or into a container by holding it at an angle

Eg: Pour the oil into the frying pan and heat.

”

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Kitchen verbs

Scramble

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Scramble:
to cook an egg by mixing the
white and yellow parts together
and heating it in a pan
Eg: You scramble the eggs, I'll
make the toasts.

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Kitchen verbs

Simmer

“

Simmer:

[intransitive, transitive] to boil gently, or to cook something slowly by boiling it gently

Eg: Bring the soup to the boil and allow it to simmer gently for twenty minutes.

”

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Kitchen verbs

Slice

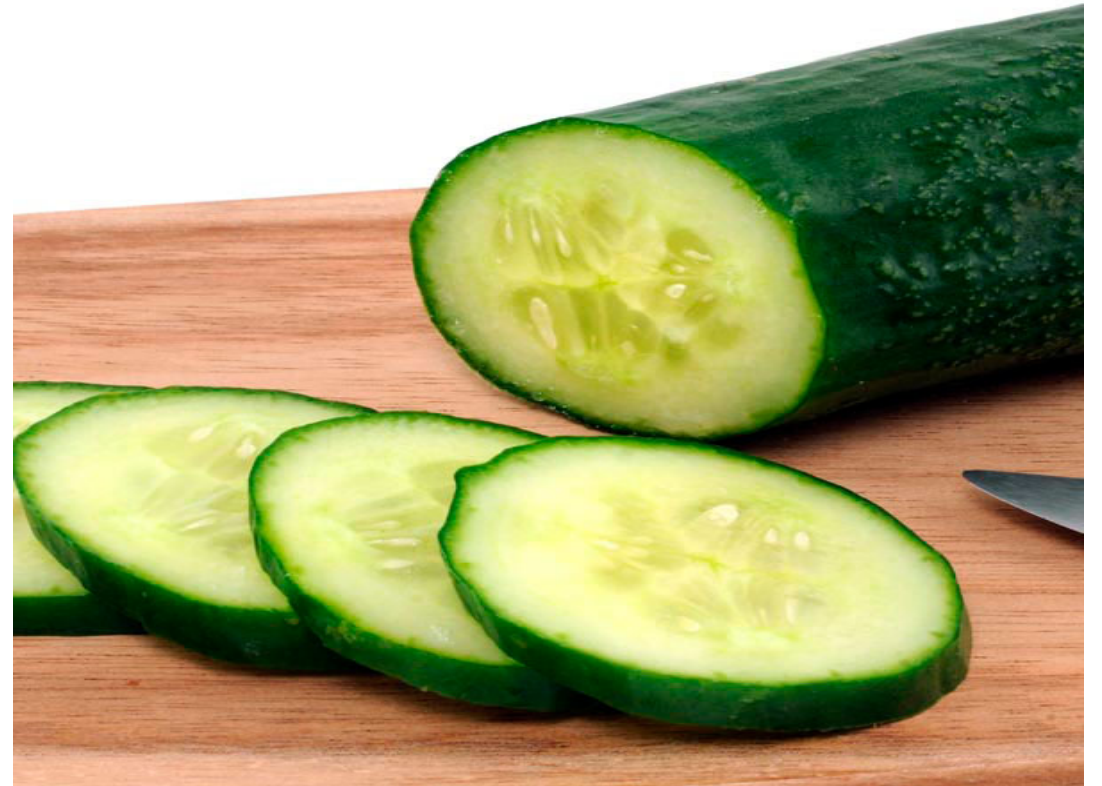
“

Slice:
[transitive] (also slice up) to cut
meat, bread, vegetables etc into
thin flat pieces.

*Eg: Slice up a cucumber and
add it to the salad.*

”

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Kitchen verbs

Spread

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Spread:
[intransitive, transitive] to put a soft substance over a surface
Eg: I like to spread honey and cream cheese on my cranberry bread.

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
